**Annual Report to the Membership, 2007**

**Board of Directors:**

The Board met twice, in Pittsburgh in February and in Sydney, Australia in July. Discussions continue to focus on stewardship of financial resources and increasing visibility of IAML-US. Our Non-Profit corporate tax status, established provisionally in 2002, was reviewed by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, and that status confirmed permanently. There is no dues increase for FY 2008, which now begins in January rather than October. Travel grants to the Sydney meeting were not awarded. However guidelines for the administration of the Lenore Coral Travel Grant have been created (see [http://www.iamlus.org/coral\\_travel\\_grant.pdf](http://www.iamlus.org/coral_travel_grant.pdf)), and awards await substantial enough accrual of gifts. Manuel Erviti has completely and elegantly revised the IAML-US Web site at <http://www.iamlus.org/>. We are exceedingly grateful to the Music Library Association for granting us an exhibit table in Pittsburgh, and also advertisement space in *Notes*, both without the usual fees. Thanks are due to Barbara Mackenzie for negotiating the former, and James P. Cassaro for offering the latter.

The **Next Annual meeting** will be held on Feb. 22, 2008, 2:00 – 3:30 p.m., in Newport, RI. Minutes of the Pittsburgh meeting will be distributed and approved at that time.

**Membership:**

On Oct. 25, 2007, the membership stood at 119 institutional and 75 personal. The previous year ended at 137 and 79, respectively.

The **Donated Materials Program** continues under the able leadership of Marjorie Hassen. Naxos Digital extended its provision of access for one simultaneous user to the music library of the Jagiellonian University in Krakow through Dec., 2007. The late Melva Peterson's complete run of RILM went to the Biblioteka of Matica Srpska in Novi Sad, Serbia, and a large number of items from the library of musicologist Leeman Perkins were donated to two music libraries in the Czech Republic. The American Musicological Society contributed three copies of volume three (Motets and Chansons) of the collected works of Johannes Ockeghem to libraries in Croatia, the Czech Republic, and Poland.
